<p>Employment – Recruitment Process Notify applicants who have been invited to participate in the interview or assessment process that accommodations are available on request to support participation in the process. Consult with the applicant to provide suitable accommodation that take into account the participant's accessibility needs due to a disability. <p>Employment - Workplace Emergency Response Information Provide individualized workplace emergency response information to help employees with disabilities when required in accordance with established procedures. When an employee who receives individualized workplace emergency response information requires assistance, and with the employee's consent, the employer shall provide this information to the person designated by the employer to provide assistance to the employee. Individualized workplace emergency response information shall be reviewed when the employee moves to a different location in the organization; their overall accommodations needs or plans are reviewed; or when the employer reviews its general emergency response policies.</p>	January 2012	Human Resources	Completed, with processes in place for on-going compliance

<p>Employment - Individual Accommodation Plans</p> <p>Have a process in place to provide individual workplace accommodate plans where requested by an individual with a disability. Individual accommodation plans will be developed in accordance with the requirements of the IASR.
